

April in Lviv

Camp at Svity Club, April 3-7

At the beginning of April, we organized a five-day rehabilitation camp at the Svity Club for adolescents affected by military actions and children of military personnel. This meant that we worked productively for five whole days, discussed important topics, and actively spent time together.



The future of Ukraine cannot be imagined without Ukrainian values and traditions, so we pay considerable attention to them in every camp program and introduce children from different parts of the country to them.



April in Lviv

Camp at Svity Club, April 24-28

In April, we organized another five-day rehabilitation camp at the Svity Club for adolescents affected by military actions and children of military personnel. Overall, during the month, 17 new children aged 12-16 participated in the camp program. The daily program consisted of sessions with psychologists, English language lessons, masterclasses, lunches, and snacks.

Second Session of the Camp

In Cherkasy, the second camp for adolescents aged 12-16 took place. Participants recovered, bonded, enjoyed delicious lunches and snacks throughout the day. Every day, they attended new masterclasses: making angels in the Ukrainian style, painting eco-bags, wax and paint pysankas, as well as conversational English lessons.



They also held a strategy game session together with the first session, fostering teamwork, communication, and coordinated action.



April in Khmelnytskyi

First Day Camp in Khmelnytskyi

In April, the "Svity" space in Khmelnytskyi launched. The month began with a five-day camp for teens affected by military actions and children of military personnel. For them, it was a great opportunity to make friends in a new city, gain new knowledge and skills during the camp. The children actively spent time, first establishing rules that everyone promised to follow, then dividing into teams. Svity members played games, participated in masterclasses, and experienced real childhood.



Group Session with a Psychologist




April in Khmelnytskyi

Teenagers got acquainted with interesting games, starting with Mafia. The game teaches emotional control, skillful debating, and respect for other players. Intuition and analytical skills developed during the game will help participants solve complex situations in life.



Next was the Cash Flow game. Cash Flow is a globally known business game that helps teenagers develop a conscious attitude towards money and the ability to effectively manage finances. The game teaches planning and setting financial goals, as well as realizing the importance of a disciplined approach to spending
