



September in Cherkasy

Training for Teenagers: "You Can"

At the "SviTy" club in Cherkasy, a training session titled "You Can" was conducted to empower children to recognize their potential to influence their city positively, making it more comfortable and modern. The youth represent an active segment of society, brimming with fresh ideas and inspiration, and this training provided them with the tools to understand how to bring those ideas to fruition. The session aimed to enhance social responsibility, develop leadership qualities, familiarize participants with practical steps toward change, and encourage them to create their own initiatives and projects.



Workshop: "Brooch in National Colors"

Participants in the workshop had a wonderful opportunity to unleash their creativity and craft truly unique items that they could use daily. To foster a comfortable atmosphere and inspire creativity, the group enjoyed fragrant tea and hot toasts before diving into the artistic process.



September in Khmelnytskiy

Training with a Psychologist: "I Am Who I Am"

At the club in Khmelnytskyi, children participated in the training session "I Am Who I Am," during which they engaged in a series of intriguing exercises. The first activity involved tossing a ball while asking each other questions, which facilitated deeper understanding and helped participants discover common traits. In the second exercise, the children sought out objects that resembled them; they first described the object and then articulated their own qualities, explaining the similarities. The third exercise utilized a bowl of water, which participants had to pass to one another with their eyes closed, ensuring that it did not spill. This activity fostered a sense of care for one another and created an atmosphere of complete trust.



Workshop: "Painting Tote Bags"

The children immersed themselves in the world of creativity during a masterclass on painting tote bags! Together, they crafted unique, stylish eco-bags that reflected each participant's individuality. The attendees had the opportunity to test their artistic skills, resulting in one-of-a-kind creations. Such activities not only nurture creativity but also instill a sense of pride in their own work.



September in Zhytomyr

Art Therapy: "Autumn Tree"

Autumn is the most vibrant season of the year, and the children at the "SviTy" club in Zhytomyr were inspired to infuse their inner world with color! They engaged in an art therapy session where they explored a new technique – dot art – creating a powerful metaphor known as the Tree of Strength. This technique allowed the teenagers to constructively release stress, enjoy the painting process, and gain the necessary resources during the challenging period of September adaptation.



Origami: "Dove of Peace"

Origami offers numerous benefits for children that extend far beyond simple paper folding. The process requires precise finger movements, which aid in developing fine motor skills and promote logical thinking and imagination, as participants must follow instructions and anticipate the final outcome. Origami encourages creativity and innovation, especially when children begin to design their own models. It serves as an excellent way to engage children while simultaneously enhancing their skills and abilities.
