Kids of Ukraine 2023

We provide humanitarian aid and, in collaboration with the Dobry Brat Charity Foundation, organised a mental restoration day camp SviTY for internally displaced teenagers and military families. There are also permanent clubs in Lviv, Khmelnytskyi, Cherkasy. We are on the way to open clubs in: Kyiv, Dnipro, Odesa, Ternopil, Zhytomyr. This initiative was launched on the World Children's Day. This is both a symbolic date and a sense that we invest in every day of our work.

Safe space for teenagers



Support and **mental recovery** programme created by qualified specialists helps children adapt to new realities.



Psychological consultations and workshops, **thematic trainings**, English lessons, various activities, and many more events are held for children weekly.



We do our best for the children to **overcome fear**, distract themselves from the war, and simultaneously discover themselves, gain confidence and new skills.



Traumatic events can cause **severe consequences** which we cannot allow to happen.

Launch 25 clubs around Ukraine and ensure their continuous operation



Costs*

Total costs	7000-9000\$
Costs related to the fund maintenance	+10-15%

*The costs may be higher, depending on location and program, salaries etc. or lower, if there is support from partners, for example, free assistance is provided use of premises.

On average, the budget of one location per year is from \$90,000 to \$110,000

We are opening fundraising

for summer camps in the Carpathians with a program of psychological rehabilitation for teenagers

Rehabilitation costs:

Program for 1 child - \$400

Goal for the summer: to rehabilitate 570 children

As for now we have funds for: 125 children

Program for 125 children – **\$50 000** (570-125 = 445)

As a result we need additional funds for 445 more children

The amount needed: \$178 000



Goal: to carry out rehabilitation in the Carpathians for **570 children**

Amount to be raised: 178 000 \$ (for 445 children)



The program of the camp in the Carpathians includes:

- communication with psychologists
- set of values and group discussions
- thematic trainings and practices
- English lessons
- rafting on the river with instructors
- walks and climbing a mountain
- sports games
- watching movies in the open air
